



NARRATIVE OF ATTACKS

- 8. Frankfurt Illuminating flares embled crews to identify the target visually. The markers were well placed, and the bombing was concentrated, with a slight tendency to spread westwards towards the end of the raid. Good areas of fire were seen on both sides of the river, and the glow was visible for 100 miles. Smoke rose to 10,000'.
- 9. Stuttgart The Master Bomber reported that the marking and bombing were both accurate and concentrated. From here, too, the facts were visible for 100 miles.

DAY RECORDLISSION

- One Frankfurt Severe damage was caused, after t entirely in the western half of the city. Large areas here were devastated; the centre of Frankfurt had suffered a like fate from revious attacks. Transportation was seriously affected; 9 bays of the roof of the main railway station were half destroyed, and much damage was caused to the railway repair sheps, the locomotive depot, the railway workshops, large goods sheds in the cain goods station and many subsidiary buildings. Industries, too, were heavily hit, including the alfred Taves aircraft-components works (pr.1), the adler-Werke and (m.F.V's pr.1), the two Max Gerner aircraft-components factories (both pr.2) and at least 9 other factories. The power station at the west harbour and a gasworks were also damaged. Business and residential property suffered severely, especially in the Bockenheim district.
- the bombing fell on the town centre, where 25 entire street blocks, upart from many other buildings, were gutted. The area 3.7. of the man station, centred on the Konig Strasse, was left completel revestate. 



EOW CEST WHICE

Jeguate photographic cover was not obtained until 15th. September; and some of the severe damage then revealed must be attributed to the P....F. attack of 26/27th. August (see N.R. No. 693) and to the U.S. 3th. Air Force raid of 30th. August. Nevertheless, most of it was probably coused by the attack under review. The devostated area extends from the city morshalling yard for some 21 miles along the west bank of the Hafen as far as Damensburg, and for 6 miles along the east bank to the suburb of Heikendorf. The 3 great shipbuilding yards and the neval arsenal which constitute the vital industry of Kiel were hard hit, together with the Neufeldt und Kuhne torpelo factory, the large munitions depot at Mankeburg and 5 other industrial premises. The old town, the modern shopping centre and the chief business/residential area of the city formed part of the devastated area.

ENERY DEFENDES

8. Fighter opposition was astonishingly slight. Only 5 of our circuaft reported being attacked, and no more than one loss occurred in combat. (The B/A involved was itself destroyed). Our benders flow below 2,000' as far as 0530 E., and kept signals silence until they reached 0700 E., thus denying the enemy early warning of their approach. The MADREL SCREEN which noved a long way across the North Sea at 2300 hours helped to deceive the controllers, who apparently anticipated no more than a spoof attack or a minelaying effort. The ground defences were also slight, the heav, barrage exploding for the most part below our aircraft. Searchlights formed 5-10 cones, into which the light guns fired ineffectively.

EVERY AIRCRAFT DESTROYED

9. One fighter (S/E) was destroyed over the Little Belt, after it had shot down a borber. 3 more German machines were down, ed, 2 by bombers and 1 by a British fighter.

CASUALTIES

10. 6/490 aircraft (1.25) were lost. Only one was seen to go down in combat, over the Little Belt. Flak losses were reported to have occurred S. of Esbjerg (2), over the target (3) and at Sylt (1-2); but some of these observations may refer to the 4 losses sustained by Bomber Support aircraft. One Halifax crashed soon after take-off and was wrecked. No serious damage (apart from the losses) was sustained from enemy action.

13. 21/27 Masquitas of 100 Group and 13/21 of 1.D.C.P. completed intruder patrols. Aircraft of 100 Group claimed to have probably destroyed a Ju.138 S.E. of Kaiserslautern, and to have dranged 3 U/I aircraft. 2 abortive chases also took place. 12 heavy aircraft carried out openial duty and H/F jamming patrols. No aircraft was lost.
