SUCCESSION

Two strong forces of bombers were sent to attock Gaarbrucken, 20 miles ahead f the U.S. Third write. The first force was detailed to bomb the mershelling yards, int found them " covered with broken cloud and thick haze. After several abortive orking attempts, the lister Homber ordered crows to abandon the mission. The second force, despatched to blanket the town, found the target clear of cloud, and alivered a devastating attack, destroying half of the built-up area and damaging any factories and berracks. Mesquitos visited forlin and several targets in W. ermany; and mines were laid in the Miel canal and off Heligoland. Only 5 of the 99 aircraft engaged were lost.

#### MARGATIVE OF ATTACK

8. <u>Horshalling Yards</u> 2 Mosquitos marked the target, but the illuminiting flares were scattered, and the Master and Deputy could not identify the *P* through the cloud and haze, although each made several runs down to 10,000 ft. The Deputy backed up the existing markers, and some aircraft bombed these; but the bombing was scattered until, at H+3, the Master Bomber ordered errors to abandon the mission.

9. Town The target was well illuminated, and the T.I. were well grouped round the 1/P. The bombing was accurated and concentrated, and one exceptional explosion at H+16 illuminated the whole sky. Late reconnaissance Masquitos reported that the whole town was ableze.

#### D. . . . . . . . ISS. NCE

10. These two attacks, together with that delivered by the inverteens on 14th October, largely devistated the town. The old town 2. of the river was almost annihilated, and even outlying districts such as Burbach, Halstott and St.Johann wer badry hit. The great steel plant of Vareinigte Huttenwarke (pr.1) had every harge building damaged and almor buildings destroyed. Industrial damage was midespread; the Luttgens which factory, the Haschinenkeu ...C., the Portland Comentwarke and over 20 minor works were severely hit. Many sheds in the marchalling yards were destroyed, although the tracks escaped lightly. Military comps suffered heavily, the infantry berneeks, dragoon berracks and artillary borracks all being gutted. The main post office, the control fire station and many other public buildings were destroyed. 9 buildings of the gasworks were gutted, and 2 bridges across the daar scribusly lamined. These attacks were estimated to have destroyed 50, of the fully milt-up area.

#### ENERY D.FAICES

11. It the time of these attacks, Saarbrucken stool only 20 miles from the front line of the U.L. Third army; but fighters had been active in defence of this area in recent miles, and the bombers were briefel to fly below 2,500 ft. across Prance as for as 0.50E, and to preserve signals bilence. The first force sined at Mainz, but swam, southwords beyon! Trier, while aircraft were still climbing. None of this force reported being engaged in combat; and the juns were hampered by the haze and patchy cloud. In hour later, MEDOW droppers simulated another force bound for Mainz and Frankfurt, and Masariton bombed the latter town. Then the main force of the night flow due cast across France, contaivery low, towards Scarbrucken. These bombers lid report a few combats near the target, but in no instance was a British pircraft damaged. The flak was fired in the form of a loose berrage over a wide tree. Our bombers claimed no victories over energy fighters, but a minelayer destroyed a Juild8 and bomber support aircraft damaged 5 more 2/a.

## C.SU.LTL'S

2. Cosmulties were extremely light; 3/551 sircraft, all the losses being sustained by the carlier force on the marthalling yards. One fell to target flak, and the other 2 were seen to blow up over France on the way out. The cause of these losses is uncertain, but one is thought to have flown into a hillside. 15 aircraft were damged by flak, all slightly. No deange was sustained in compet; and no serious accidents occurred in landing or taxying.
