On the afternoon of the 22nd photographic ocver revealed that this plant had been severely damaged and that production was suspended.

Monheim: The intention was to destroy the oil refinery and finishing plant.

When ph. tographic cover was obtained on the afternoon of the 21st. February parts if the target were obscured by cloud and smoke from fires, but new severe damine was shown to the cil refinery. The large oil tank area was seen to be turning fiercely. On 14th Larch further cover revealed that there were as signs of activity in the severely damaged refinery section.

Both Reishelz and honnois were eventually abandoned.

#### ENEMY DEFENCES

E. Bimbers were supported by a MANDREL screen behind the front line, a WINDOW feint from the Bonn area towards Hannever and another past Mannheim to Heilbroan, strengthere! by a misquito raid on Mannheim and an attack by Liberature on Neustalt. A diversionary sweep made across the North Sea was designed to hold fighters in North West Germany and prevent them from flying against the main force. This was successful in that 3 enemy aircraft engaged our aircraft in campat over the sea, although knowledge of fighter movements in that area was virtually mil.

Ruhr based fighters managed to inflict casualties on our main dorces. Interceptions were made on the last half of the Dortmund stream and there was intense combat along the route to Dortmund, over the target, and on the way out of the mahr. After the fighters had been drawn up towards Dortmund some of the found fresh compacts in the Cologne area upon the arrival from the east of the Halifaxes attacking Reisholz and Monhoim.

There was slight to moderate heavy flak at Dortmund and accurate predictal heavy flak to the North of Dusseldorf. Very slight heavy flak was experienced at Gravenhorst. 



This was an outstanding attack with destruction on a scale as complete as any target ever attacked. There was hardly a single building left intact throughout the whole area, and apart from the tremendous gutting by fires many areas of buildings were lovelled to the ground. Danage to railway facilities was also heavy, the goods yard was completely burnt out, rolling stock destroyed, two of the river bridges had collapsed and the real over the rail bridge spanning the marshalling yard was hit and rendered unserviceable.

Herten: The intention was to sink U-boats and shipping, and to destroy dock-yard facilities.

Cover thained in the day after the attack showed very severe damage to the dockyard area which has been tractically devastated. A large floating crane, a floating workshop and many vessels which were seen alongside before the attack were no linear present at the time of photography.



1. <u>Berlin</u>: 2 attacks were made on the town through 10/10ths cloud. The first attack was made by 55/55 Mosquitos from 22/28,000 ft. The majority of crews bombed on markers before they disappeared into cloud. The remainder bombed on floater T.1's which were clearly visible forming a line N.3./3. d. across the target. Bomb flashes seen through the cloud indicated that the attack was generally confined to the centre of the marker concentration.

Six hours later 41/41 acsquites made a second attack from 24/27,000 ft. The majority of crews bembed on floater T.1's which were seen # - E across the target. The remainder bended the clow of markers as they fell into cloud. Bombing was generally directed at the centre of the marker group, but weather conditions prevented any observations of results or bomb flashes.
