- 44th Ops. Hamburg Five a/c. successfully attacked the target. Bursts and fires were observed. One a/c. is missing from this operation. On an attack on Emden alternative targets, Seestermunde and Wesermunde, were bombed and explosions and fires were observed. Owing to icing conditions an attack on Ostend was abandoned and bombs jettisoned safe. Four day sorties air tests and local flying practice.
- 2-12 No flying due to weather.
- 3-12 No flying due to weather. Three R.A.F. Sgts. were awarded the D.F.M. entry lists names and authority.

- 11-12 Twenty-two day sorties air tests and local flying practice. One night sortie night duals landing practice.
- 12-12 Nineteen day sorties air tests and local flying practice.

Six day sortiesair tests and bombing practice.
