Three hours and 30 minutes of Day Operational Training logged. Word has been received from No. 6 (R.C.A.F.) Group that several new crews will be posted in shortly to supplement our dwindling total of 25. Disappointing news for the Squadron Adjutant was communicated via the latest Air Force Routine Order, which lays down the maximum age limit for transfer to the Canadian Active Army as 28 years. 	2.3.45.		Weather - Clear. Our 14 aircraft returned safely from last night's Operation against Mannheim, and pilots and crews expressed satisfaction on the success of the raid. We have another 14 crews ready for today's operations. As promised a new crew arrived, skippered by CAN/J.9232 P/O C.R. Bacon - and was inducted into the Squadron. A flap of minor proportions was created by a funny announcement that a mass outbreak of German Prisoners had resulted. Later it was learned that one or two instead of one or two had escaped. Fifty five minutes of day flying training completed.			
	3.3.45.		Weather - Clear. All our aircraft returned safely from last night's target Cologne, and bomb aimers reported a "Field Day". No operation in sight but crews standing by. The tranquillity of the night was disturbed by the presence of enemy raiders who paid a special call, but did no damage. A total blackout was imposed through the medium of the Master Switch. Personnel using slit trenches got cold feet and in future will ensure that blankets are supplied to offset the accumulation of rain water covering the floor of the trenches. The physiological effect of the raid will be beneficial and should help to defeat the air of complacency displayed by some personnel. The best training day for many months was achieved with a total of 34:30 hrs. chalked up. Twelve aircraft participated in day Cross-Country. One new crew reported with CAN/J.25435 - P/O R.C. Bartox as Pilot.

Fifteen aircraft detailed for an operation today, which makes three in a row. The priority of operations allowed only two hours and 30 minutes day training.		Pages 1, 2, 3 attached Abstract
	14.3.45.		Weather - Fair. All fifteen Kites reported back from support yesterday, and crews are resting up for a sortie today. The Battle Order details 14 aircraft for a daylight effort. An even ten hours of daylight training kept all crews busy, who were not engaged in operations. We are the fortunate recipients of 40,000 cigarettes, and 4,400 packages of gum - gifts of The Agent General of Canada. The gum is strictly for airmen, but cigarettes will be distributed to all Squadron Personnel.		
	15.3.45.		Weather - Fair. Once again 14 aircraft returned safely from the previous days sortie on 24th March. Two Battle Orders are in preparation for ten and seven aircraft respectively. This marks the fifth successive operational day. Crews are enthusiastic and cheerful and want to continue hammering the enemy on a non-stop basis.
