The "Adoption" took place at a Lord Mayor's Luncheon which was attended by King Commander Owen, the Officer Commanding, Flight Lieutenant Lowry, the Padre and Flight Lieutenant Pugh, R.C.A.F. Press Liaison Officer. As a result of the publicity given this event, numerous invitations have been received from citizens of Bradford, offering the hospitality of their homes to Canadian personnel on leave or pass. In this connection it is interesting to note that many of these invitations have come from people whose sons or other relatives have spent some time in Canada under the British Commonwealth Air Training Plan and have been entertained by people in various parts of Canada. In offering their hospitality they have expressed the wish to reciprocate for this courtesy and in several cases have particularly requested that they be put in touch with Canadian personnel whose names are in the particular localities in which their relatives were trained in Canada.
