Skipton 29/9/43 (Contd) parade was held this afternoon for personnel of 433 at this station. PAtt. Pickford spoke to them explaining the situation as far as it concerned them. Organization is proceeding as satisfactorily as possible under the circumstances. 30/9/43 Order is gradually emerging from disorder. The orderly room is organized as far as possible at this stage, a filing system having been set up, documentation, leave and passes, and the regular routine of an orderly room proceeding comparatively smoothly. The orderly room staff may be inexperienced, but they are enthusiastic and good workers. They voluntarily return after supper in order to get things done. The typewriter borrowed from Leeming is rather decrepit, but it works - most of the time, anyway. Fersonnel are being farmed out to the squadrons here, some are working on roads, sanitary duties and other jobs. Equipment is arriving and includes bomb containers, bomb trolleys, starter trolleys, 250 lb bomb beams, accumulators, Herlin tools, ladders etc. We have no M.T. equipment yet, except the C.O's car which is locked up in the garage. Once we receive our typescriters, stationery and publications our initial problems will be solved. Arrangements were made today for transporting men from No.5 site to the communal mess, and a number of bicycles have been issued.
