All took off successfully, and attacked the primary, and, with the exception of "Y" who landed at Carnaby because of brake trouble, all returned to base. The weather over the target was clear with good visibility, and, from all reports, this was a very concentrated effort. Two large explosions were seen, and smoke from the target was visible for one hundred miles. No enemy aircraft were sighted, but slight flak was encountered.		
Groft	5.10.44		There were no operations to-day, however, plenty of training was carried out. Major Nicholas, 6 Group Headquarters Flight Specialist, came to this Squadron this afternoon and lectured to all airmen on the various types of Heavy Flak.

Bombing was from 0845 to 0905 hours from 17,000 feet to 20,000 feet. One of our aircraft landed at Waddington on return to refuel. There were no sightings of enemy aircraft but flak was intense, predicted and accurate. All aircraft returned safely. Eighteen aircraft from this Squadron were detailed for another attack on HAMBURG to-night. All took off successfully. Aircraft "O" N2920, with CANC.1771, P/L D.T.
