Graft	1.3.45		All thirteen aircraft detailed for Operations took off successfully, commencing at 1120 hrs. The attack was on Mannheim. Shortly after 1700 hrs word came through that we would be required for fourteen aircraft for early morning tomorrow. By 1918 hrs. all our aircraft had landed safely back at base. Thirteen claim to have attacked the primary in 10/10ths cloud. No assessment possible due to cloud. J17676 P/O R. Sibbald, the Wireless Operator in aircraft "B" was injured, being hit in the cheek with a piece of flak. Fortunately it was not too serious and P/O Sibbald will be back on Operations in a few weeks time. However he did not let this keep him from carrying on. He kept an accurate check on his log of all his duties and when his skipper wanted to land at an emergency dress he insisted they carry on to base, though obviously feeling the need for rest and attention. On examining his log after landing it was found to be complete even to landing time, with the entry: "18.00 hrs. all O.K. except R/W." G13278 P/L H.C. Hallett and JB325 S/L D. Boyle, "B" Flight Commander attended a Station Sports Conference & the purpose of the conference was to alert personnel in charge of various sports and to plan a program of recreational activities in connection of hostilities. All aircrew detailed for Operations were awakened at 0130 hrs. this morning. Navigation briefing was held at 0200 hrs. and Main at 0300 hrs. Take off time was delayed. All fourteen aircraft then took off successfully between 0611 hrs and 0707 hrs. for std attack on Kassel. All aircraft returned safely to base by 1342 hrs. Fourteen aircraft claimed to have attacked the Primary.		
Graft	2.3.45		No Operations today. A parade was held at 1600 hrs. of all aircrew personnel not flying to receive the Efficiency Trophy given to the Squadron Commander by AIR Commodore F. Sibbald acting A.G.C. of No. 6 Group. During the day eight aircraft were on training flights. Four new exams were checked out on Day and Night training. Midday training was done by Wireless Operators. A lecture was given by the Navigation Leader to Navigators on Navigation assessments. At the regular morning session all aircrew were told of the present military situation on all front. German Air Force activities given along with these lectures prove most interesting. At approximately 19.30 hrs. word came through that we would be required for an early morning operation. Briefing times were going to be 0200 hrs. and 0300 hrs. however this effort was cancelled about 23.00 hours.		for annual inspection in progress

Graft	6-3-45		Early this morning most of the personnel on this station were awakened by the sound of cannon fire from an enemy aircraft. Some Halifax aircraft were diverted here because they had been followed back from the Continent by intruder aircraft. The Halifax aircraft were just about out of petrol when they got this far so had to land. The runway lights had to be put on. One aircraft was shot down by an intruder, landing in Durham County, however the crew all got out alive. An intruder flew over our dinner letting go with two cannon bursts. No one was reported hurt. Fourteen aircraft were detailed for Operations today. Navigation briefing was at 1300 hours, main at 1430 hrs. At approximately 1455 hrs., the attack was cancelled. All crews stood by for further instructions until 1700 hrs. when the Squadron was definitely stood down. One aircraft was air tested however there was no flying training as all our serviceable aircraft were bombed up.		
Graft	5-3-45		Fourteen aircraft were detailed for Operations today. Briefing times were 1300 hours for Navigation and 1500 hrs. for Main briefing. All fourteen aircraft took-off successfully by 1700 hrs. for an attack on Chemnitz. Fourteen aircraft claim to have attacked the Prinzipal through cloud. Assessment of the attack was difficult because of clouds. The regular morning conference at 0915 hrs. was attended by all aircrew personnel. Some night vision training was done by Air Gunnery. Members of new crews carried out ground training in their respective sections. CAN 111498 P/L R.G. Hunt, D.F.C. the Squadrons Bombing Leader was screened from Operations with 29 trips and 109 points to his credit.		
Graft	6-3-45		From the attack on Chemnitz last night all aircraft had returned to England and landed by 0330 hrs. All landed at base with the exception of "I" piloted by J88956 P/O J. Kitchener who landed at Garmisch. This aircraft was attacked by an Me109 fighter and also collided with a Halifax Aircraft. The report on aircraft "I" from Garmisch states: Aircraft hit by 20 M.M. explosive cannon shell. Starboard wheel and under-carriage damaged. Center section skin and No. 1 fuel tank (starboard) punctured. Starboard elevator and starboard fin and rudder extensively damaged. Rear turret and area around turret damaged in collision". The aircraft was categorized K.L. No further Operations today. Five new crews were on night Cross Countries.

At approximately 10.30 hrs. today word came through that we would be required for fifteen crews. All fifteen crews had taken off successfully by 1645 hrs. for an attack on Hagen. The senior Intelligence Officer, 0364J S/L W.A. Bentley accompanied J1308 P/L J. Rothenbush, piloting, aircraft "P" on this trip.


